At a duly convened meeting the following motion was passed by a quorum of Council:

Whereas:

- The four year term of the Chief and Council elected on May 6, 2021, under the First Nations Elections Act, expires on May 5, 2025;
- B. The Electoral Officer has advised the Band that the Deputy Electoral Officers shall be:
 - (i) Diana Hoggard, Band employee; and
 - (ii) Lee White, who is an associate of the Electoral Officer;
- C. The Electoral Officer has advised the Band that he will work with the Band on the appointment of an officer to maintain law and order during the nomination meeting and at the poll on voting day; and
- D. Certain resolutions must be made by Chief and Council, to begin the May 1, 2025 election process for Chief and Council.

BE IT RESOLVED:

- The nomination meeting shall be held on March 4, 2025, from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm at the Roundhouse, 380 Cornwall Road, Ashcroft, BC VOK 1A0 (the "Roundhouse").
- 2. As electors who will not be able to get to the poll at the Roundhouse to vote on election day, can use the mail-in ballot process, there will be no advance poll prior to the election day.
- 3. The election will be held at the Roundhouse on May 1, 2025, with the poll to be open for voting by electors from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm.
- 4. The fee of \$250 per candidate for election as Chief or Councillor is waived in full.
- 5. The timeline of important dates and events for the election, attached as a Schedule to these resolutions, is approved and made part of these resolutions. Chief and Council may adjust the timeline as necessary from time to time to preserve the integrity of the election process.
- An information package about the election, including the qualifications for election to Chief and Council, will be posted on the Band website.
- The guidelines of the Electoral Officer for peaceful conduct by the electors, for each of the nomination meeting, voting day, the counting of ballots and any recounts, will be posted on the Band website.
- 8. Marcus Hadley of 255 Linden Avenue, Victoria, BC V8V 4E6, will act as the Electoral Officer having conduct of this election.

December 17, 2024	Council Resolution to Authorize the Election
	Council authorizes the election process by Council Resolution.
	The resolution confirms that the guidelines of the Electoral Officer for peaceful conduct by the electors, at the nomination meeting and on election day, will be posted on the Band website.
December	Electoral Officer Appointment
17, 202	The Electoral Officer is appointed by Council Resolution: First Nations Elections Regulations ("FNER") s. 2(1).
	The Electoral Officer must have completed a training program approved by Indigenous Services Canada ("ISC"): FNER s. 2(2).
	The Electoral Officer should not be a Band member: First Nations Elections Act ("FNEA") s. 15(2).
December	Deputy Electoral Officer Appointments
17, 2024	The Deputy Electoral Officers are appointed by the Electoral Officer: <i>FNER</i> s. 2(4). A Deputy Electoral Officer can be a Band employee but cannot be a Band member.
December	Officer Appointment
17, 2024	An officer is appointed by the Electoral Officer, to maintain law and order during the nomination meeting and on election day: <i>FNER</i> , s. 20(3).

5.	February 4, 2025	Information Package
		An information package about the election, including the qualifications for election to Chief and Council, is posted on the Band website. This package will address the court decision in <i>Pittman v. Ashcroft Indian Band</i> 2022 FC 1380 (FC), the result of the January 25, 2024 membership admission vote, and why certain persons who had been Band members, will not be eligible to be nominated for office, to make or second a nomination, or to vote on election day.
6.	February 4, 2025	Electoral Officer's Peaceful Conduct Policy
		The Electoral Officer's Peaceful Conduct Policy for the nomination meeting and election day, is posted on the Band website.
7	February 4, 2025	Voters List
	4, 2023	The Band provides the Voters List to the Electoral Officer: <i>FNER</i> s. 3. The Voters List includes the last known postal address and e-mail address of each elector: <i>FNER</i> s. 4(1).
8.	February 6, 2025	Assembly of the Mail in Nomination Packages
	0, 2023	The Electoral Officer and the deputies attend at the Administration Office to assemble the mail in nomination packages.

February	Notice of Nomination Meeting			
11, 2025	The Electoral Officer:			
	(a) posts a notice of the nomination meeting and the Voters List at the Administration Office; and			
	(b) sends to all electors by mail and e-mail:			
	(i) the notice of nomination meeting and mail-in nomination package;			
	(ii) the voter declaration form; and			
	(iii) the request for a mail-in ballot package, setting out all the requirements for an elector to obtain a mail-in ballot package from the Electoral Officer.			
	The notice of nomination meeting shall have the contents set out in s. 5(2) of the FNER.			
	The notice of nomination meeting must be given at least 25 days before the day of the nomination meeting: $FNER$ s. $5(1)$.			
March 4,	Nomination Meeting			
2023	The nomination meeting must be held at least 35 days before the election: FNER s. 7(1).			
	The nomination meeting shall be carried out in accordance with the Electoral Officer's Peaceful Conduct Policy.			
	The nomination meeting will be transmitted by video feed to one or more other sites, for viewing by the electors.			
	The nomination meeting must remain open for at least three hours: <i>FNER</i> s. 7(4). The nomination meeting will be held in the Roundhouse, 380 Cornwall Road, Ashcroft, BC VOK 1AO from 4 pm to 7pm.			
	Written nominations or seconding of candidates, together with voter declaration forms, can be delivered, mailed, e-mailed or faxed to the Electoral Officer up to the beginning of the nomination meeting. Nominations can also be made orally at the nomination meeting: <i>FNER</i> s. 6.

11.	March 7, 2025	Candidate Declaration
		Within three days of the nomination meeting, all candidates must submit to the Electoral Officer a signed Candidate Declaration, accepting the nomination for only one position for which he or she has been nominated, and confirming his or her eligibility to be a candidate.
		Please see the FNER s. 9(1).
12.	March 11, 2025	Notice of Acclamations
		The Electoral Officer makes a written declaration as to any Chief or Councillors elected by acclamation, and that an election will be held on the election day for all remaining positions: FNER s. 11.
		If all positions are filled by acclamation, the Electoral Officer posts in the Administration Office a notice of the persons elected by acclamation and that an election will not be held. This same notice is mailed by the Electoral Officer to all off reserve electors: <i>FNER</i> s. 12(1).
13.	March 11, 2025	Ballots
		The Electoral Officer prepares the ballots: FNER s. 13.
14.	March 11, 2025	Assembly of the Mail-in Ballot Packages
		The Electoral Officer and the deputies attend at the Administration Office to assemble the mail-in ballot packages.

Item	Date	Description
15.	March 13, 2025	Notice of Election and Mail-in Ballot Packages
		The notice of election is posted by the Electoral Officer at the Administration Office setting out:
		(a) the election date and the location and hours of operation of the poll; and
		(b) the other information required by s. 14 of the FNER.
		The Electoral Officer mails the mail-in ballot package to all electors who have made a written request for it and have provided proof of identity. The package has the contents specified in s. 16(1) of the FNER.
		Both the posting of the notice of election and the mailing of the mail-in ballot packages must be completed not later than 30 days before the day on which the election is to be held: <i>FNER</i> ss 14 and 16.
		The notice of election and the declaration re lost mail-in ballot are posted on the Band website.
16.	April 25, 2025	Deadline for Requesting Mail-in Ballot Packages
	2023	This is the last day on which an elector can request in writing that the Electoral Officer deliver on reserve, and otherwise forward by mail, a mail-in ballot package to that elector: <i>FNER</i> s. 16(2).
17.	May 1,	Election Day
	2025	The poll is at the Roundhouse, 380 Cornwall Road, Ashcroft, BC,VOK 1A0, and is open for in person voting by the electors from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm: <i>FNER</i> ss. 19 and 20(4).
		The election process and the vote count will be carried out in accordance with the Electoral Officer's Peaceful Conduct Policy.
		The election process and the vote count will be transmitted by video feed to one or more other sites, for viewing by candidates, the scrutineers and interested electors: See the Electoral Officer's Peaceful Conduct Policy.
		Any candidate can withdraw at any time prior to the close of the poll by submitting to the Electoral Officer a written declaration of withdrawal: <i>FNER</i> s. 10(1). This candidate is considered to have received no votes: <i>FNER</i> s. 10(3).
		All mail-in ballot packages received by the Electoral Officer prior to the close of the poll will be counted. Any mail-in ballot packages not so received are void: FNER ss. 17(1)(f) and 17(3).

Date	Description
	Every elector who is inside the polling station at the time the poll closes is entitled to vote: FNER s. 21(12).
	After the close of the poll, the mail-in ballot packages are opened by the Electoral Officer, their contents verified, and the ballots placed in the ballot box by the Electoral Officer: <i>FNER</i> s. 22.
	All ballots are then counted by the Electoral Officer and the deputies: <i>FNER</i> s. 23.
	A tie is resolved by the Electoral Officer who conducts a draw: FNEA s. 24.
	A recount is conducted by the Electoral Officer if there are five or fewer votes between a candidate who would otherwise be declared elected and the candidate getting the next highest number of votes: FNER s. 24(2).
	The Electoral Officer prepares and signs a statement of the election results including the number of votes for each candidate, the names of the elected candidates, the number of ballots that are rejected, and the number of ballots that have a portion declared void: <i>FNER</i> s. 23(f) and 24(7).
	The Electoral Officer then makes a public declaration to the Band membership of the election results: <i>FNER</i> s. 24(1).
	The Chief and Councillors are elected to a four year term starting the day of the election, which term takes effect immediately following the election: <i>FNEA</i> ss. 3(3) and 28(1).
May 2	Election Results Posted
2023	The Electoral Officer posts the statement of the election results in the Administration Office, and forwards a copy to ISC: FNER s. 24(7).
	The Band posts the statement of election results on its website.
June 2,	Contesting the Election
2023	This is the deadline for filing an application in BC Supreme Court or the Federal Court to contest the election: <i>FNEA</i> s. 32.
September	Destruction of the Ballots
4, 2025	The ballots and election documents are destroyed by the Electoral Officer, unless the election is contested: <i>FNER</i> s. 25(2).
