Chief Scotty Campground

The Ashcroft Indian Band has a campground with 20 RV sites and 5 tenting sites. Chief Scotty Campground is located at 2425 Cornwall Road in Ashcroft. The cost for an RV site is \$30 per night and the tenting sites are \$22. There are no extra fees for extra people or pets.

The RV sites have water and sewer hookups (30 amp). There are free showers and heated washrooms. Right beside the campground there is a new playground and two beautifully groomed baseball fields. Pets are welcome but must be on a leash at all times. Located just off the Trans Canada Highway, the campground is within easy walking distance of Tim Horton's and the Esso Travel Centre and a few minutes' drive to Ashcroft and Cache Creek.

Health information

Do you know about the Plan W Program?

If you have a status card, you are eligible for many Overthe-counter medications free of charge.

This includes such things as:

- acetaminophen
- allergy medications
- antacids
- antibiotic creams
- asprin
- calcium supplements
- · children's vitamins
- cold medications
- constipation remedies
- · dietary fibre
- ear & eye drops
- folic acid
- lice treatment
- mineral oil
- prenatal vitamins
- vitamin A (B1) (B6) (B12) C, D
- Wart treatment
- Yeast infections
- zinc oxide cream
- & many more....

How do you access over-the-counter medications covered by Plan W? You can get them in two ways:

- 1) A prescription from a doctor or nurse practitioner or
- 2) A recommendation from a pharmacist

How do you get a pharmacist recommendation? Talk to your pharmacist about your condition. If the pharmacist assesses it a safe and effective treatment you will be able to have the medication/vitamins free of charge. The pharmacist needs to fill out a form which you will need to sign.

What is the CNA and what does it do?

The Citxw Nlaka'pamux Assembly (CNA) is a not-for-profit organization that was formed in 2013 to manage and administer the agreements relating to Teck Highland Valley Copper Mine (HVC) on behalf of Ashcroft Indian Band, Boston Bar First Nation, Coldwater Indian Band, Cook's Ferry Indian Band, Nicomen Indian Band, Nooaitch Indian Band, Shackan Indian Band and Siska Indian Band (the Participating Bands)

Although the CNA was created only 12 years ago, its work is rooted in hundreds of years of history and a legacy of protecting the nłe?képmx people and our culture, values, and territory. Headquartered in Merritt, B.C., the CNA provides training and job readiness along with cultural, social, and technical programming to over 2700 members of the eight Participating Bands.

A Fascinating Piece of our History



A beautiful landmark of the Ashcroft Indian Band is the historic church, St John of the Latin Gate. Built in the 1860s by the Cornwall brothers, it was originally in another location and transferred to its current location in 1920. It underwent some needed restoration in 2018.

Ashcroft is of English origin and is derived from the Old English words "æsc" meaning "ash tree" and "croft" meaning "enclosure" or "small farm." Therefore, the meaning of Ashcroft can be interpreted as "enclosure or farm near the ash trees."

Loans/mentoring available for Indigenous women and youth

The Indigenous Women Entrepreneurs program is the brainchild of Community Futures Development Corporation of Central Interior First Nations and the National Aboriginal Capital Corporation Association. Tailored to assist Indigenous Women entrepreneurs they support with one-on-one business support, training, workshops as well as micro loans and grants. They will be offering workshops throughout the Interior in upcoming months. We will keep our members posted when workshops will be available in our area.




